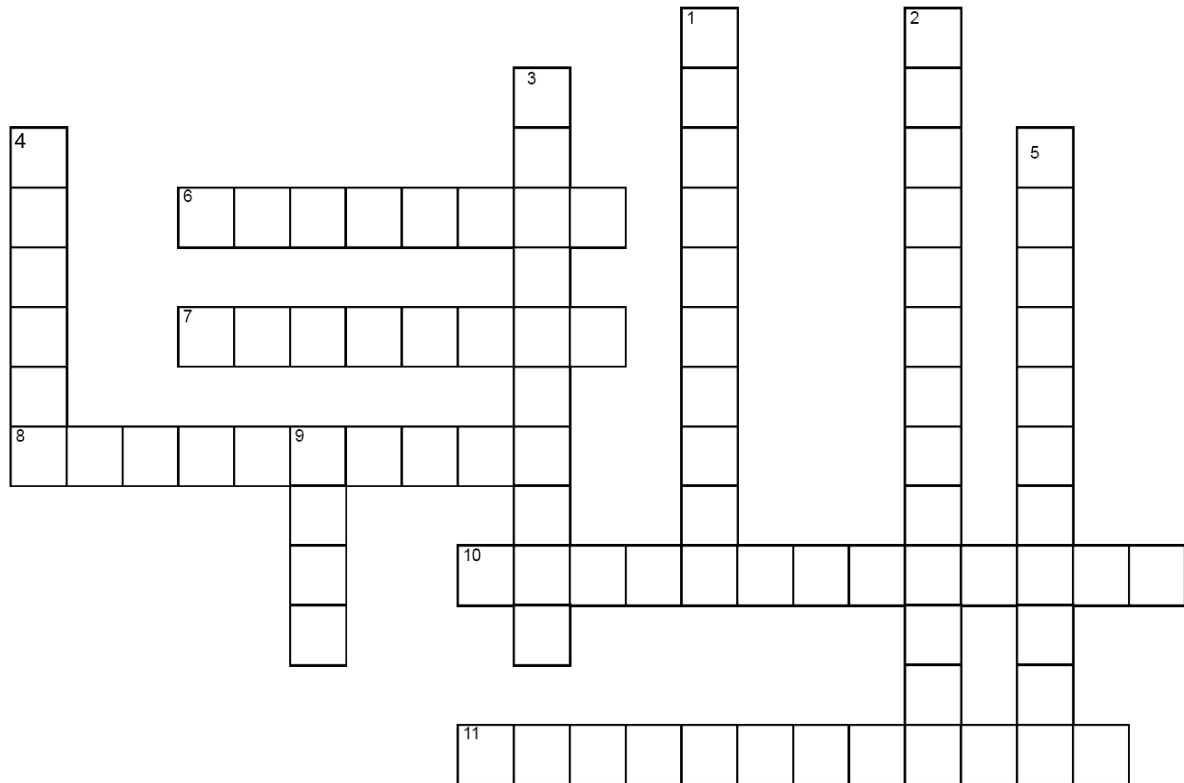
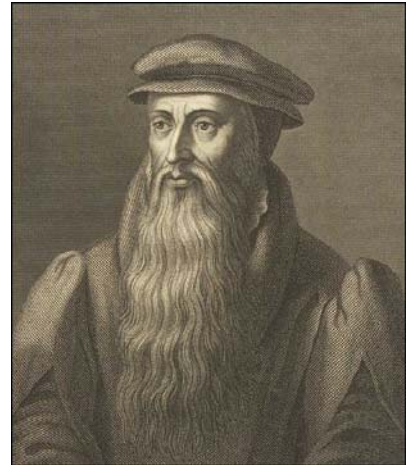


John Knox (1514-1572)

John Knox is the father of Scottish Presbyterianism. He was a converted Roman Catholic priest. He suffered as a galley slave in the French navy for 19 months. He served English king Edward VI. When Mary Tudor became queen of England, Knox fled to Geneva and came under the influence of John Calvin. He returned to Scotland and laboured to establish a Reformed Church, governed on Biblical lines, and independent of the State.
